



Using Photoshop to resize images

- 1. Open Adobe Photoshop.
- 2. Create new.




3. Enter your dimensions in the appropriate fields.






4. Select Create.




5. File > Place embedded.






6. Select your file and click Place.




7. Use the corner boxes to change the size of your image to fit your project space. Once it is to your liking, push the enter key.







8. Your image is now the size of your project space.




9. To save your image, go to File > Export > Export As...






10. You do not need to change anything on this first screen. Verify that your image format is either .JPG or .PNG under File Settings. Click Export.





11. Update the name of the image file in the pop-up window. Click Save. Make sure you've saved your image in a place where you can easily access it, like a specific folder or on your desktop.



12. Once the image has been resized, optimize it using ImageOptim or another program.
